

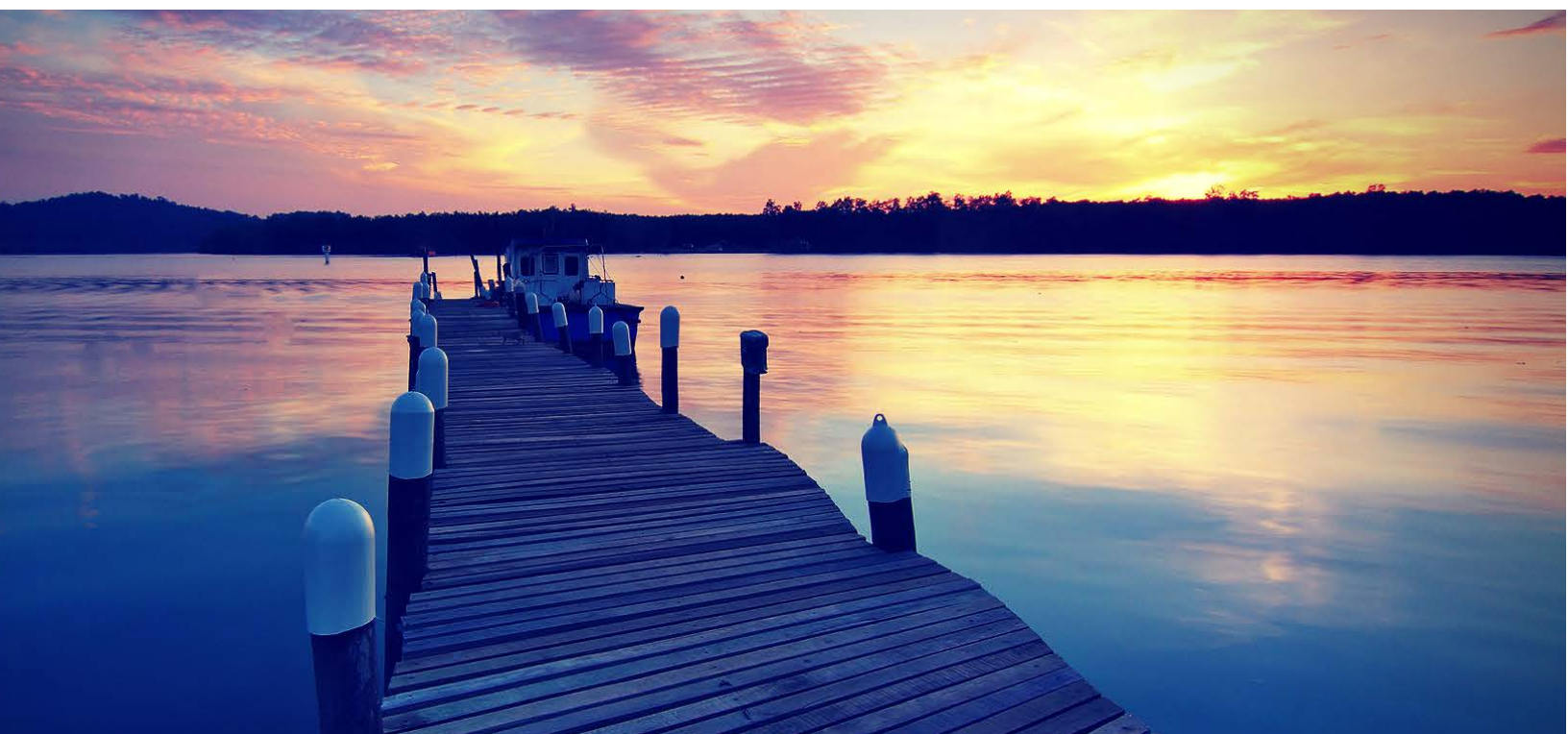

Message from the Literacy Department

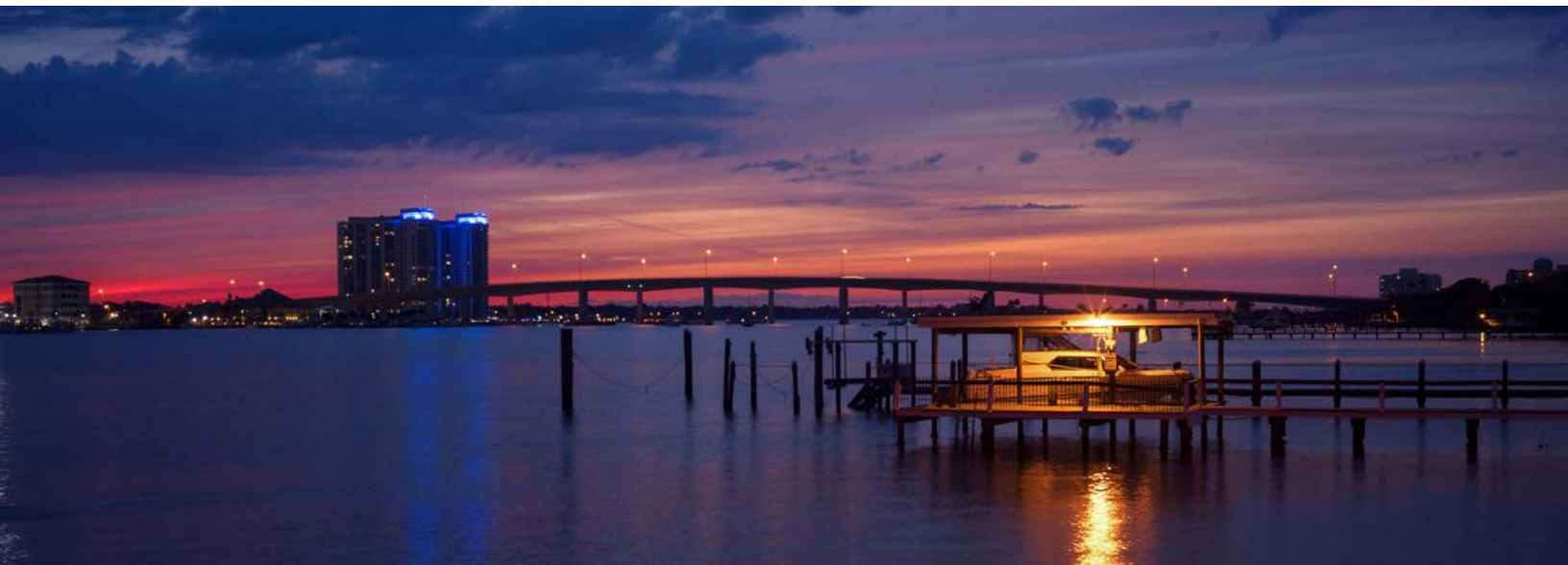

Tutor Training Wrap Up, and Next Training

As always, the Literacy Council hosted four New Tutor Training sessions. Our final session of the year was held in October at the West Tampa Branch Library, where we had ten new tutors trained. This year, we trained 77 new tutors total, many being placed quickly.

We really appreciate the work our tutors have done this year, and we certainly intend to keep on training new tutors in the future. The next New Tutor Training will take place on February 2nd, 2019 at the Seminole Heights Branch Library. Be sure to tell everyone you know who may be interested in volunteering!

Also, did you know that we have changed the language concerning tutor commitment from “an hour a week for a year” to “48 hours?” We want to make sure everyone knows that we can be flexible with the amount of time tutors and students spend together. Therefore, if you can do two hours a week with a student, then you will complete your 48 hours in six months and still have as many contact hours, and frankly, a more concentrated learning session. Actual hours depend on the availability of the student, of course.

Conversation Corners Year End

We had another great cycle of Conversation Corners in 2018. We have lost a few locations and gained some others. We had nine groups running in the Fall cycle of 2018, which is a typical number of groups.
