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### Message from the Literacy Department

This summer, the Hillsborough Literacy Council is making its way back from the effects of the Covid shutdowns. We have experienced a decrease in tutors and students since then, but we are rebuilding. We have been steadily training new tutors and accepting calls from new students. There had also been a staffing shortage that was slowing down our ability to provide student and tutor matching, but we have rounded a corner. You will see below that we have a new Literacy Assistant to help get students and tutors matched, as well as respond to HLC communications.

However, even as we celebrate those positive changes, we must relay that Eric Hughes is stepping down as the Literacy Coordinator. We hope that his position will be filled by the library in short order but staffing shortages have been affecting the library as they have with so many other services and businesses in the community. This may cause a slowdown in new tutor training, so we appreciate the continued patience of the HLC community.

Despite all of these changes, the Hillsborough Literacy Council is still serving the needs of adults who need literacy and English language services for free through our public libraries.

We would like to welcome our new Literacy Assistant, Giselle Suastegui. She comes to us from the Riverview Public Library. Giselle is fully bilingual in Spanish and English.
